Building Fund at Holy Trinity Parish,

Holy Trinity Parishioners, On behalf of Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), Parish Finance Council (PFC) and our Buildings and Grounds Committee, I am extremely delighted to announce that donations to the Building and Grounds Fund of our Parish, for the year 2023, totaled an incredible \$31,673. We had asked for your support in November as we are looking at a number of major projects for the Parish. Thanks to your generous offerings in November and December, this amount will now allow us, in the spring, to obtain quotes from various contractors for the repair of our front stairs. We ask that you continue to consider making donations to the Parish Building and Grounds as we are also considering repaving and painting lines in the parking lot, estimated cost of \$150,000 and possibly putting new flooring in the Church basement. We have not obtained quotes on this as yet, however would anticipate costs similar to the \$20,000-\$25,000 we are looking at for the front stairs.

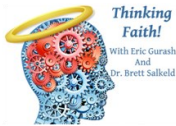

De Margerie Lectures on Christian Reconciliation and Unity, Grassroots Ecumenism with Rev. Dr. Karen Petersen Finch, an ecumenical theologian in the Reformed tradition who specializes in dialogue with Roman Catholic theology at the local, national, and international levels. Her book, *Grassroots Ecumenism: The Way of Local Christian Reunion*, is currently inspiring multilateral dialogue among lay people in the West Island of Montreal.

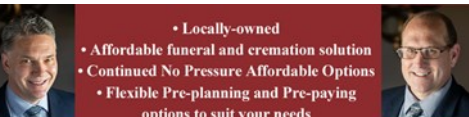
