The Truth and Reconciliation Committee of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Regina is excited to announce the opening of the "Igniting the Spirit of Reconciliation" art display at the Neil Balkwill Center (2420 Elphinstone St.) through the month of February in Regina. This display is an art project created by students of Balcarres Community School (90) and Vibank Regional School (4), featuring the 94 TRC Calls to Action.

The artwork will be on display from February 3 - 29, 2024. During the tenure of the display, there will be four special presentations.

<u>February 21 (Wed. 1 pm – 3 pm)</u> – Members of the Regina Survivors Circle will share their stories about the trauma experienced in Indian Residential Schools and their healing journeys.

<u>February 26 – (Mon. 1 pm – 3 pm)</u> – Presentation by Susan Beaudin - Sacred Treaty Relationships envisioned by the First Nations leaders when negotiating and signing of Treaty 4, 1874.
